RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EMPLOYMENT OF SPECIAL LEGAL COUNSEL IN THE FUNDING OF \$33,000 OUTSTANDING FIRST MORTGAGE WATERWORKS REVENUE BONDS OF THE VILLAGE OF AMANDA, OHIO, WITH THE PROCEEDS OF U.S. TREASURY OBLIGATIONS.

WHEREAS, this Council desires to undertake the requisite proceedings to consummate a plan for funding \$33,000 outstanding First Mortgage Waterworks Revenue Bonds of an original issue of \$90,000 of said revenue bonds dated November 1, 1952, maturing serially through 1992 (herein the "Obligations"); as outlined by The Cincinnati, Ohio, who have indicated the feasibility of said plan of funding of the outstanding Obligations with U.S. Treasury Obligations at a substantial interest cost savings to the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Amanda, Fairfield County, Ohio:

Section 1. That this Council proposes to pursue the plan of funding the \$33,000 First Mortgage Waterworks Revenue Bonds of the Village of Amanda, dated November 1, 1952, as outlined, and in order to consummate said plan, Messrs. Peck, Shaffer & Williams, Cincinnati, Ohio, are hereby designated special legal counsel, to prepare the necessary legislation, documentation and other proceedings, in cooperation with the Village Solicitor, to consummate the funding of said outstanding Obligations and the defeasance of the lien thereof on the properties and revenues of the municipally owned waterworks system and facilities.

SECTION 2. That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of the Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code.

- (H) Section 135.13, R.C., provides that "Interim deposits shall be evidenced by certificates of deposits maturing in thirty or more days but in no event more than one year from date of deposit."
- (I) Section 135.04, R.C., provides that any institution mentioned in Section 135.03, R.C., which has an office located within the territorial limits of the subdivision is eligible to become a depository of the active funds of the subdivision. An institution located outside the limits of the subdivision may be designated as the depository of the active funds only if the aggregate amount of active deposits of the public moneys of the subdivision applied for by the eligible institutions located within the subdivision is less than the aggregate amount to be deposited as such as estimated by the governing board.
- (J) The governing board is authorized at any time during the period of designation to request new bids for interim deposits from eligible institutions, upon a determination by resolution that the applications for interim deposits in force no longer reflect prevailing interest rates when the treasurer or governing board consider that the terms of the applications for interim deposits no longer reflect prevailing interest rates.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY/VILLAGE OF AMANDA

A Resolution Endorsing the Report of the House Public Utilities Committee and Urging Implementation of its Recommendations; Endorsing H.B. 964, H.J.R. 41 and S.J.R. 25 and Urging their Enactment, and Declaring an Emergency.

- WHEREAS, On March 2, 1982, the House Public Utilities Committee of the Ohio General Assembly, Representative Ronald James Chairman, adopted a report regarding the Gas Purchasing and Pricing Practices of Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc., and on April 7, 1982, Representatives Benny Bonanno, R. James, Malott, Camera, and Bowers introduced H.B. 964 to implement the recommendations of that Report;
- WHEREAS, Representative Bonnano, Mahnic, Mallory, R. James, Stinziano, Locker, Colonna, Jones and Orlett have introduced H.J.R. 41 and Senators McCormack, Schwarzwalder and Valiquette have introduced S.J.R. 25 in the Ohio General Assembly to inform the President, Congress, and the Governor of the legislature's strong opposition to all plans for an acceleration of the deregulation of natural gas prices;
- WHEREAS, the City/Village of Amanda and its citizens are served by Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc., and according to a recent Consumers' Counsel survey, Columbia's rates are higher than those of Ohio's other major gas utilities;
- WHEREAS, customers of Columbia Gas have experienced large increases in their gas bills, paying approximately 35% more for gas during the winter of 1981-82 than during the previous winter heating season, with such increases having had a particularly severe impact on senior citizens, those on fixed incomes, and low income households, having drained the budgets of schools and businesses, and having placed a heavy burden on all Ohio consumers;
- WHEREAS, Columbia Gas bills are composed of two types of components: the base rate which is set by municipal ordinance or the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) and is not uniformly regulated; and the gas cost recovery rate, controlled by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and the PUCO, which jumped 32% from September 3, 1981 to March 8, 1982;
- WHEREAS, the City/Village of Amanda is paying one of Columbia's 742 different base rates, and the 646% variation from Columbia's lowest base rate in the New Albany unincorporated area to its highest in Stafford demonstrates the existence of significant price discrimination;
- WHEREAS, such variations in base rates are in part attributable to specific ratemaking problems including Columbia's opposition to uniform rate negotiations, Columbia's failure to provide even basic cost of service and rate of return information to communities with which it negotiates, and the large number 33 in the first 3 months of 1982 of different applications for rate increases filed at the PUCO by Columbia Gas;
- WHEREAS, Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation has passed through Columbia Gas of Ohio, its sister company, disproportionate increases in gas costs in comparison to other gas pipelines;
- WHEREAS, the City/Village of Amanda is in agreement, in principle, with the recommendations of the Report of the House Public Utilities Committee on the Gas Purchasing and Pricing Practices of Columbia
